NOMINATIONS FOR THE JVM JOURNALISM AWARD NOW OPEN

The Jane Velez-Mitchell Journalism Award Nominations Opens April 1st



<u>Portland, OR (March 31, 2011)</u> –Soroptimist's Northwest Coalition Against Trafficking opens the nomination period for journalists who are dedicated and consistent in keeping the "war on women" visible to their audiences throughout the year.

The Jane Velez-Mitchell Journalism Award is named after award-winning journalist Jane Velez-Mitchell, host of "Issues" on HLN.
